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## TBI, DEMENTIA & AGING

Director Ron Fernandez presented as part of the Western New York Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association educational series on dementia. His talk explored the physical and cognitive challenges faced by individuals living with traumatic brain injury (TBI) as they age, including an increased risk for dementia. He discussed the need for collaborative group support for people who have both a TBI and Dementia as well the need for support services for people with TBI's that do not meet the waiver program criteria.



### TBI STUDY: UNIVERSITY AT BUFFALO

We'd like to bring awareness the work of Dr. Vijaya Prakash, an Assistant Professor at the University at Buffalo in the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences. His research is focused on Auditory/vestibular neurodegeneration in occupational hazards and neurotrauma such as blast induced traumatic brain injury and cerebrovascular accidents. Dr. Prakash's current research study assesses the vestibular function in adults with traumatic brain injury. He is currently looking for individuals between the ages of 18-80 years old to participate.

The study is on-going and will consist of a single session, which will last approximately four hours each. The duration can be split into two sessions if the subject experiences fatigue. Dr. Prakash will be looking at the integrity of the vestibular system and balance in individuals with a history of head injury in the past ten years and in healthy adults. This study is on-going, and subjects will be compensated \$12 per hour for their time.


